Also known as green regime of highly precious gem world.


It was befitted in the crown of Kings & necklaces of queens since the Mogul era of 14th century.



ZAMBIAN, COLOMBIAN, AND ETHOPIAN

ZAMBIAN EMERALDS

- Zambian Emeralds first discovered in 1928.
- The deposits are located near the Kafubu River in the Ndola Rural Restricted Area.
- Initial investigations did not reveal good quality gems.
- Exploratory work was continued in the 1940s and 1950s.
- During 1970s, local miners discovered several more deposits.
- Kafubu area became major producer of good quality emeralds.
- Emerald deposits are now distributed over the area of 200 km².
- Zambia is considered the world's second most important source of emeralds by value.

Because of lower incidence of "eye-visible inclusion" - it has has great level of clarity.

Due to clarity, light reflects much better, enhancing their color and making it more appealing.

ABOUT COLOR

It has green hue with bluish tinge.

The presence of chromium lends a bright green color.

ABOUT THE CUT

GIA – Emerald is difficult to cut.

Has significant fractures & brittle nature.

Also has hexagonal crystal structure.

Cutter must maximize effect of hue, tone & saturation.

Can be cut in different shapes.

Most popular: square or emerald cut.

These maximize shape and weight of crystal.

Takes about 1 hour to facet 8-10 gems from just one side.

COLOMBIAN EMERALD

Colombian emeralds are globally famous for their quality. • Generally, the most expensive per carat. • Comparatively, price of F1 Colombian emerald is equivalent to F3 Zambian emerald. • Each mining location worldwide produces a different color variation of emerald. • The leafy green shade is unmatchable with the gradient of green available in other emeralds.





CLARITY OF COLOMBIAN EMERALDS

Eye-clean emeralds are especially valuable.

Emeralds that have no eyevisible inclusions are very rare.

Typically contains inclusions that are visible to the unaided eye.

Usually displays jagged or fluid inclusions.

Formed between 40 and 65 million years ago.

Colombian emeralds were mined by the indigenous people of what is today, Boyacá Province.

Experts estimate that natives were mining and trading Colombian emerald as early as 1000 BC.

Emeralds were among the first gemstones mined in the world.

Colombia is home to the largest source of emeralds worldwide.

Yield a finer variety than other emerald mines across the globe.

Colombian variety grabs the top position for transparency, crystallization and fire.



ETHIOPIAN EMERALD

Discovered in August 2016. • Comparable to those mined in Colombia. • Had set the gem world afire. • Located in central part of Ethiopia. • Sits in the northern section of richest Precambrian belt. • Formed some 650 million years ago.

HOW IS IT DIFFERENT FROM OTHER EMERALDS?

- Colombian emerald displays intense, pure green color & Zambian emeralds displays darker shade of green.
- Whereas Ethiopian emeralds are known for their lighter green shade.
- Colombian emeralds tend to be high in chromium and vanadium, but low in iron.
- Emeralds from Ethiopia have less chromium and vanadium, relatively high iron content.
- Ethiopian emeralds are less expensive than its Brazilian and Zambian counterparts.



Must consider the depth of color durability and inclusions when cutting.

CLARITY

Most prized emeralds are highly transparent.

CARAT WEIGHT

Comes in wide range of sizes.

SOMETHING TO ADMIRE ----HISTORICAL EMERALD PIECES





ELIZABETH TAYLOR'S BULGARI EMERALD BROOCH

Richard Burton once said "the only word Elizabeth knew in Italian was 'Bulgari."

While filming Cleopatra, he bought her an emerald and diamond brooch from Bulgari as a wedding gift.

Worn at their 1964 wedding, it later sold at Christie's for \$6.13 million, making it the most expensive single-stone emerald jewel ever sold.

THE MOGUL MUGHAL EMERALD

This 217.80-carat Colombian emerald was sold to a figure in the Mughal Empire and intricately inscribed with a Shi'a prayer in Arabic, along with the date 1107 A.H. (1695 AD), during Emperor Aurangzeb's reign.

Its religious inscription suggests it belonged to a courtier, not the emperor himself, as the Mughal rulers were Sunni.

The emerald changed hands multiple times and was last sold at Christie's in 2001. It now resides in the Museum of Islamic Art in Doha, Qatar.





THE ROCKEFELLER EMERALD

In 1930, John D. Rockefeller Jr. bought a brooch—believed to be by Van Cleef & Arpels—for his wife, Abby.

Its centerpiece was a stunning 18.04-carat emerald.

After her passing, the emerald was reset into a ring for their son David. In 2017, it sold at Christie's for \$5.51 million, setting a record \$305,500 per carat, and was renamed the Rockefeller-Winston Emerald.

PRINCESS FAIZA'S EMERALD & DIAMOND NECKLACE

Crafted in 1929, this platinum necklace features a striking fringe of nine dropshaped Colombian emeralds, suspended from a chain of baguette and epaulet-cut diamonds with pavé-set scalloped links.

It includes a pendant clasp with an emerald drop and bears the French assay mark for platinum.

Originally made for royalty—housed in a case marked with the khedivial crown—the piece was later modified in 1937. Certified by Van Cleef & Arpels and SSEF, it remains a timeless example of Art Deco luxury.





THE CHALK DIAMOND

The Chalk Emerald, a 37.8-carat gem of exceptional clarity and deep velvety green color, ranks among the finest Colombian emeralds—sourced from the famed Muzo and Chivor regions.

Once part of a Maharani's necklace in Baroda, India, it was later recut and set by Harry Winston into a platinum and gold ring, framed by 60 pear-shaped diamonds.

Donated to the Smithsonian in 1972 by Mr. and Mrs. O. Roy Chalk, it remains a highlight in the National Museum of Natural History.


